# Proposed Anti-Charter School Legislation Update (republished from last week)

In our March 29 and April 5th *Friday Flyers*, I published articles from the California Charter Schools Association ("CCSA") regarding proposed anti-charter school legislation. Each of these bills are currently continuing through the legislative process, including being passed out of their initial sub-committees. Generally speaking, I believe it is appropriate for both myself and our school to be as apolitical as possible. Having seen / heard from some of our parents regarding this proposed legislation and how they can continue to be informed and perhaps get involved, I do think it's appropriate to share CCSA's informational and organizational website regarding this legislation:

#### If these bills pass, how would it affect MMCA?

MMCA's charter was renewed for five years last year, meaning the earliest these proposed pieces of legislation could possibly affect us is the 2023-2024 school year. Under current law, the primary basis for charter renewal is related to performance - primarily student performance, but also fiscal and organizational performance. Under these proposed laws, charter renewals would no longer be based on performance, but rather tangential issues, like whether the "charter school is creating a negative fiscal impact to the sponsoring school district." Further, current law allows charter schools to appeal school district denials of charter petitions first to the County Board of Education, and then ultimately the State Board of Education. The proposed legislation eliminates appeals to the County and State, giving the local school district sole control. We are monitoring the proposed legislation, and we are working with our legal team to ensure that we have contingencies in place if we have to deal with this in 2023-2024.
